

Sachin Tendulkar was born on 24 April 1973 in Mumbai. He went to Sharadasharam Vidhyamandir, a high school in Mumbai, where he began his cricketing career under his coach Ramakanth Achrekar. He attended the MRF Pace Foundation during his schooldays to get trained as a fast bowler, but Australian fast bowler Dennin Lillee, who saw during training, was not much impressed and suggested that Tendulkar should focus on his batting instead.

While at school, his extraordinary batting skills got noticed by the sports circuit. In the 1988 season, he scored a century in every inning that the played. In one of the interschool matches that year, he had an unbroken 664-run partnership with his friend and teammate Vinod Kambli.

When he was fourteen, Indian batting legend Sunil Gavaskar, a great Indian batsman of that time, gave him a pair of his own light pads. This touching gesture greatly encouraged the budding cricketer, who, twenty years later, broke world record of thirty- four test centuries.

When he was young, Tendulkar would practice for hours on end in the nets. If he became exhausted, Achrekar would put a one-rupee coin on the top of the stumps, and the bowler who dismissed Tendulkar would get the coin. It Tendulkar passed the whole session without getting dismissed; the coach would give him the coin. Tendulkar now considers the thirteen coins as his prized possessions.
