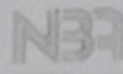


Dr. Dasari Ayodhya has given information about the Intellectual Property Rights in which he informed about Copyrights, Trademarks and Trade Secrets.
